

Cycle route near Fuglsang 31 km

Start your trip for example at Fuglsang with its beautiful, expansive parklands, where you can experience amongst other attractions Thujahulen, a natural wonder created by two trees.

- Ride along Ko Allé and Vaasevej, where in the dry-stone wall you can see a stone that according to tradition bears the devil's footprint.
- To the left along Møllevvej and Flintingevej. Outside Flintingevej 44 stands an urban tree, a chestnut, planted in 1886.
- Further along Vestermark and Byskovvej, where immediately after the large farm you turn left into the forest. At the estate just ahead keep to the left and follow the small signs to a large and very well preserved passage grave.
- The same way back, out along Tømmerholtvej, just before the fork in the road turns, take the forest road that leads through the woods.
- After a couple of kilometres you arrive at the Stikhokken (a high pile of branches), the only one left in Denmark.
- Ride out along Hydesbyvej, which you follow to the left and then along Rosen-lundvej, by Teglskoven and Skovstræde through Sønderskovhjemmet.
- A little further ahead turn left through Frostrup Forest.
- Out on the asphalt road, just after the estate, there is a forest path in to the right that leads to the next biggest tree in Denmark "Flådeegen" (The Navy Oak).
- Ride further to the left along Sløsserupvej and to the right along Kildevej.
- By the orchard at Kildevej 5 stands one of the largest stones on Lolland, the "Lundekilde-stone".
- Ride out along Fuglsangvej and back to Fuglsang. Behind the buildings, a country track leads out to Skejten, a protected landscape.
- Ride back past the new large art museum. A little further ahead, a path on the right leads out to "Gammelholm". This is a fortified area with a burial crypt surrounded by a burial mound, where the first Fuglsang was laid to rest.
